Regulatory Rate Review - Missouri

Estimated Review Timeline

To allow us to continue making important investments in our local communities, we filed a rate review request with the Missouri Public Service Commission on September 29, 2017.

The rate review process takes about eleven months in Missouri, unless all parties come to an agreement before then. During this time, the Commission conducts a full audit of our operations and financial data. Local public hearings will be held to give customers an opportunity to comment. Comments are also accepted by the Commission online or by mail. Expert witnesses will take part in evidentiary hearings.

Finally, the Commissioners will issue a decision based upon the facts and evidence in the case. New rates do not take effect until the conclusion of the case. If approved in full, the plan will result in an average increase of about \$9.56 per month (about 32¢ per day) for a typical residential customer.
